## Vynova's hazard communication obligation to contractors

- 1. When working with an external contractor or a vendor at a Vynova site, Vynova is required to inform the contractor or vendor of the hazard information relevant to chemicals present in the work area. This includes providing the contractor or vendor:
  - a. Information on Vynova's systems and procedures for handling of hazardous materials
  - b. Information on the potential chemical hazards in the area or workplace
  - c. Access to safety data sheets (SDSs) for chemicals that may be encountered
- The work area supervisor is the point of contact for a contractor or vendor entering a work area
  and is responsible for communicating hazards. On-going Vynova activities that could lead to
  contracted personnel being exposed to hazardous chemicals should be stopped before the
  contractor arrives.
- 3. Contractors/vendors must inform Vynova of any hazardous chemicals they bring onto Vynova sites that may result in potential exposures to Vynova employees, other contractors or the community.
- 4. Contractor and vendor companies and their employees are expected to be knowledgeable and compliant with all relevant regulations for the safe handling of hazardous materials.
- 5. Contractors shall provide the Vynova point of contact with the following information:
  - a. A list of chemicals they will bring on site
  - b. How the chemicals will be labeled, used, stored, transported, including quantities
  - c. Safety data sheet for each chemical
- 6. If the chemical(s) present special hazards that could potentially result in significant risk, the Vynova point of contact shall:
  - a. Review the information.
  - b. Conduct a risk assessment together with the contractor and define the required safeguards
  - c. Inform and train employees as needed
  - d. Consult with the Vynova Safety Health & Environment Department on site

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
